- I, Craig H. Durham, under penalty of perjury depose and say:
  - 1. Appellant's brief is due on or before September 19, 2024.
  - 2. Two extensions of time have been granted.
- 3. Due to the press of counsel's present heavy workload and the complexity of this appeal, he has been unable to complete the brief by the current due date. In just the last 14 days, counsel prepared for and attended an expedited and urgent hearing as co-counsel in Ada County District Court in *Raul Labrador v. Idahoans for Open Primaries*, CV01-24-13942; prepared for and conducted a lengthy deposition in *Frey v. Centurion et al.*, 1:23-cv-00141-AKB; filed briefs in support of petitions for review in this Court in *State v. Dobson*, 50609-2023, and *Jones v. State*, 50106-2022; and prepared for and attended three parole hearings, including a hearing involving a second degree murder conviction.
- 4. In addition, while counsel has begun reviewing the record, researching the issues, and preparing the brief, this case is unusually complex. The case proceeded as a capital case for much of its duration in the district court. The record is well over 10,000 pages and includes a significant portion that is sealed and confidential. The clerk and court reporters requested and received multiple extensions to compile the record on appeal. The jury trial lasted nearly four weeks, and the transcripts in the record are not organized chronologically, increasing the difficulty of counsel's review. Finally, this

was a high-profile and well-publicized case and Ms. Daybell is now serving three

consecutive life sentences. Her direct appeal deserves deliberative preparation and

review.

5. The undersigned has contacted counsel for the State, who does not object

to the extension of time.
