WHEREAS, on November 16, 2022, District Court Judge Jay P. Gaskill entered a Death Warrant against GERALD ROSS PIZZUTO, JR., in Idaho County Case No. CR-1985-22075 which was filed by the District Court on November 16, 2022, the Death Warrant orders the Director of the Idaho Department of Correction to cause the execution of GERALD ROSS PIZZUTO, JR. on December 15, 2022.

THEREFORE, this Court enters the following ORDER:

Because this Court wishes to become aware of and timely address any pending or future motions, counsel for the parties must transmit a copy of any subsequent documents filed in any federal or state court dealing in any way with GERALD ROSS PIZZUTO, JR., including any attachments and appendices, to the Idaho Supreme Court through iCourt File & Serve into Supreme Court docket no. 48786-2021, which shall be used as a depository for documents filed in any federal or lower State court matter.

Any original filings with this Court shall be made by E-filing through iCourt, with notice being provided electronically to opposing counsel.

THEREFORE, this Court shall set the following schedule for any proceeding that may come before this Court as follows:

1. Any filings must be accompanied by briefing and received by this this Court no later than Wednesday, November 30, 2022, at 5:00 p.m.;
2. Any responses shall be received by this Court no later than Friday, December 2, 2022, at 5:00 p.m.; and
3. Oral argument in this matter, if allowed by this Court, shall be scheduled before this Court on: Thursday, December 8, 2022, at 3:00 p.m.
