4. A REPLY IN SUPPORT OF MOTION TO RECONSIDER ORDER RE: VERIFIED PETITION FOR WRIT OF PROHIBITION AND APPLICATION FOR DECLARATORY JUDGMENT was filed by counsel for Respondent on April 4, 2022.

Therefore, after due consideration,

THIS COURT ORDERS AS FOLLOWS:


Respondent's Motion to Reconsider Order Re: Verified Petition for Writ of Prohibition and for Declaratory Judgment is GRANTED. Respondent shall have a total of twenty-eight (28) days from the date of the entry of the Order Re: Verified Petition for Writ of Prohibition to file a Verified Answer and separate response brief, consistent with I.A.R. 32(e), with this Court. The Verified Answer and separate response brief shall be filed no later than April 28, 2022.

The Petitioners are ordered to file a reply brief, consistent with I.A.R. 32(e), no later than fourteen (14) days after the response brief is filed.

The parties having both requested action by this Court to preserve the status quo to give the parties the ability to adequately brief this case, pursuant to I.A.R. 13(g) the implementation of Senate Bill 1309 is STAYED, pending further action by this Court.
